






The Power to Collect Taxes


- American Revolution caused debt
- Tax was necessary to pay debt
- Article 1, Section 8 of the U.S. Constitution granted Congress power to tax



The U.S. Constitution gives Congress power to collect taxes




The Federal Government Dollar- Where It Comes From






The Federal Government Dollar – Where It Goes

Tax Avoidance versus Tax Evasion

- Tax Evasion: Failure to pay legally due taxes
- Tax Avoidance: Legal means of decreasing your tax bill



Taxpayer Rights

- Information on taxpayer returns is private
- Taxpayers have the right to appeal an IRS decision
